- 3.1 Level of qualification:** 1st Cycle
3.2 Official length of programme:
Eight (8) Semesters, 240 ECTS
A full academic year is equivalent to 60 ECTS units and each semester to 30 ECTS (European Credit Transfer System) (1 ECTS=25-30 student workload hours) Compliance with the ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System) regulations started in 2007, when the Greek Legislation was harmonized with the relevant European one (Ministerial Decision No. Φ5/89656/B3, art. 1, 2, 3, Hellenic Government Gazette No 1466/2007/B). A full academic year is equivalent to 60 ECTS units and each semester to 30 ECTS.
3.3 Access requirement(s):
Secondary Education Graduation Certificate. National Admission Examinations to Higher Education administered by the Ministry of Education and Religious Affairs.

4. INFORMATION OF THE CONTENT AND RESULTS GAINED

4.1 Mode of study:

Full-time studies.

4.2 Programme requirements:

The Undergraduate Studies Program of the School of Psychology is a full-time eight (8) semester program leading to the award of a Degree in Psychology and requires a minimum of 240 ECTS credits for graduation distributed over 8 semesters as follows: 96 ECTS credits from 16 compulsory psychology courses, at least 92 ECTS credits from optional psychology courses for students who undertake a diploma thesis or at least 112 ECTS credits for students who do not undertake a diploma thesis, 12 ECTS credits from foreign language, up to 10 ECTS credits from free elective courses, 10 ECTS credits for internship, and 20 ECTS credits for diploma thesis, which is optional.

Upon successful completion of the program requirements, graduates acquire comprehensive theoretical knowledge in a wide range of basic and specialized areas in psychology, such as neuropsychology, experimental, biological, cognitive, developmental, educational, school, counselling, social, organizational and clinical psychology. Graduates of the program are expected to have achieved the following learning outcomes:

A. Scientific knowledge and skills in (i) searching, reviewing and critically evaluating the relevant literature, (ii) designing research studies from diverse methodological approaches, (iii) analyzing empirical data using quantitative and qualitative techniques, (iv) evaluating and interpreting research findings and (v) using new information technologies in all the above areas.

B. Familiarization with the ways psychological knowledge is developed and applied, in particular with those facets of knowledge that contribute to the understanding of all aspects of human behavior and to furthering the wellbeing of individuals, groups and communities.

C. Awareness and training in the following domains: (i) scientific and professional ethics, (ii) co-operation with others and teamwork, (iii) respect for human diversity and cultural multiplicity, (iv) understanding of gender issues and (v) respect for the natural and the social environment.

4.3 Programme details (e.g. modules or units studied and individual grades/marks/credits obtained):

Courses that the student has successfully attended, as well as subjects for which the student has received recognition or exemption (**COR**=Core courses, **ELC**=Elective courses, **FELC**=Free Elective Courses, **FL**=Foreign Language, **INT**=Internship, **EX**=Exchange). The first digit of the course code denotes the semester that the course has been taught and the next two digits the Department that offers the specific course.

Before the award of the Degree the student decides and declares formally which of the courses will not be taken into account (section 5, Ministerial Decision no F14.1/B3/2166, Hellenic Government Gazette no 308/87). The Degree is awarded according to the required minimum local credit units and the student may be examined in two more optional courses (art. 60, Ministerial Decision no F1.231/B1/425, Hellenic Government Gazette no 1099/2000/B).

ECTS grading (A=10%, B=25%, C=30%, D=25%, E=10%) is based on a sample of a minimum of 100 students. If the sample is not sufficient then nothing is noted (according to the Ministerial Decision no Φ.5/89656/B3, art. 4, Hellenic Government Gazette no 1466/2007/B). The ECTS grading system is based on the Annex 3 of the ECTS Guide, 2009, and on Crocker, L., & Algina, J. (1986). Introduction to classical and modern test theory. New York: Harcourt Brace Jovanovich College Publishers.

Dissertations or/and Internship projects as well are considered as individual projects and they are not graded based on a previous sample. The same stands for the Erasmus courses for which we accept the grading of the receiving institution and we convert it to the local grade accordingly.

A scale of 1 to 10 applies to the marks of each subject in the Hellenic Higher Education.

5.2 Professional status (if applicable):

Graduates of the School of Psychology at the A.U.T.H. are entitled to a license to practice as professional psychologists. The profession of psychologist is allowed only to holders of the licence, that is issued under the provisions of the Act 991/1979 (G.G. 278/V.1/20-12-1979). Psychologists in Greece work in the following sectors:

- (a) in the field of health and care (hospitals, public or private mental health services, drug rehabilitation services, institutions and organisations for people with disabilities, rehabilitation centers, day centers for dementia, memory clinics, older adults residential care institutions)
- (b) in the field of education (schools, universities, counselling centers, centers for vocational training), and

(c) in social services (e.g. municipalities employment or counselling services, NGOs).

6. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

6.1 Additional information:

The Departments of the School of Psychology of AUTH offer a wide range of courses that give the students the opportunity to structure their own curriculum based on their needs and interests. They cover three broad areas of the science of Psychology.

(a) The Department of Experimental and Cognitive Psychology focuses on the study of cognitive functions, on the treatment of cognitive, affective, language and neuropsychological dysfunctions and on the enhancement of cognitive and affective abilities throughout the life span

(b) The Department of Developmental and School Psychology focuses on the study and treatment of child and adolescence problems, on addressing problems in the educational process as well as on the counselling and vocational training.

(c) The Department of Social and Clinical Psychology focuses on understanding, assessment, prevention and treatment of psychological and psychosocial problems, and on the study of intragroup and intergroup relations and of organisations.

8. INFORMATION ON THE NATIONAL HIGHER EDUCATION SYSTEM

Pursuant to the Constitution (article 16, paragraph 5), Greek Tertiary Education is public and gratis. Furthermore, according to the legal framework, it is divided into:

- (a) the University sector (A.E.I.): Universities, Technical Universities, Fine Arts School, etc., and
- (b) the Technological sector (T.E.I.): Technological Education Institutions and the School of Pedagogic and Technological Education.

Part of the University sector is also, since 1998, the Greek Open University, which provides open and distance -undergraduate and postgraduate- education and training.

There are also state post-secondary non-tertiary Institutions offering vocationally oriented courses of shorter duration (2 to 3 years), which operate under the authority of other Ministries.

All graduates of secondary education (Geniko and Epagelmatiko Lykeio) can be admitted to Higher Education Institutions, depending on the general score obtained in national examinations that take place at the end of the final year of Lyceum. The admission system is based on the number of available places (numerus clausus), the candidates' performance, and the candidates' ranked preferences of Schools. Admission to particular schools may also require a special examination (eg drawing for Architecture, etc.).

Study programmes in Higher Education Institutions last from four to six years, depending on the subject area. Students who successfully complete their studies are awarded a Ptychio / Diploma, which permits employment or further studies at post-graduate level leading to a Metaptychiako Diploma Eidikefsis (2nd cycle) - equivalent to the Master's degree- and to the doctorate degree (3^d cycle), Didaktoriko Diploma.

Legislation on quality assurance in Higher Education, the Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS) and the Diploma Supplement defines the framework and the criteria for the evaluation of Higher Education Institutions, and for the certification of programmes of studies. These measures aim, among others, at promoting student mobility and contributing to the creation of the European Higher Education Area.
