As a final-year medical student at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens, with a prior degree in Biology from Aristotle University of Thessaloniki and a Master's in Biomedicine from Democritus University of Thrace, I am deeply committed to becoming a physician who actively contributes to the modernization and transformation of healthcare systems, both in Greece and internationally.

My academic journey has given me a solid foundation in life sciences and clinical medicine, complemented by coursework in preventive medicine, epidemiology, and research methodology. However, what truly shaped my perspective was a summer volunteering experience at the regional clinic on a Greek Island, as part of the Primary Healthcare Elective Placements Program "APOVASIS" by the Scientific Society of Hellenic Medical Students. Despite the clinic having a fully equipped telemedicine unit, the lack of trained personnel rendered it useless. Patients were forced to undertake two-hour boat trips to access basic medical consultations—highlighting the gap between available technology and practical implementation. This experience convinced me that tomorrow's doctors must be capable not only in clinical care but also in navigating and leading digital transformation.

I am currently volunteering at the polyclinic of Médecins du Monde in Athens and working part-time as an assistant in a private-sector pediatrician. These roles have enhanced my clinical skills and reinforced my belief that digital tools can enhance both access and quality in patient care—especially for vulnerable populations. Although I have not yet had formal training or experience with digital health technologies, I am eager to do so. I view this Master's as a vital next step in acquiring the knowledge and interdisciplinary skills to become a medical professional ready to lead innovation in healthcare.

The structure and flexibility of the ManagiDiTH program make it ideal for combining with my ongoing clinical training. Its international orientation, strong curriculum, and partnerships with industry and academia provide a unique opportunity to engage with real-world challenges and diverse healthcare systems. Additionally, the program's affordability makes it a feasible and sustainable option for me.

My career goal is to pursue a PhD and specialize in the field of digital health, eventually contributing to policy-making, clinical innovation, and healthcare consulting.
