3. INFORMATION OF THE LEVEL OF THE QUALIFICATION

3.1 Level of qualification

Level according to the Greek educational system: Bachelor of Nursing Science
Level according to the study structure of the Bologna Process: 1st Study Cycle.
Level according to the National Qualifications Framework: Level 6.
Level according to the International Standard Classification of Education ISCED of UNESCO: Level 6

3.2 Duration of studies

Minimum duration of studies for obtaining the degree: Eight (8) semesters or four (4) years.
Number of teaching weeks and exams per year: 32 (26 for teaching and 6 for exams).
Note: There are also 2 additional (optional) weeks for teaching and 3 for exams.
Total workload of students throughout the studies: 6,227 hours.
Number of ECTS credits required to obtain the degree: 240 Credits (ECTS). A full academic year is equivalent to 60 ECTS credits (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System) and a full semester to 30 ECTS (1 ECTS = 25-30 hours workload).

3.3 Admission requirement(s)

High School Diploma and success in the Panhellenic Examinations.
Grade 6 graduates are admitted after qualifying examinations held in December of each academic year at a rate of 12% on the number of students admitted.
Note: For all Departments of Higher Education in Greece there is a set number of students admitted per year (numerus clausus).

4. INFORMATION OF THE CONTENTS AND RESULTS ACHIEVED

4.1 Mode of study

Full time.

4.2 Programme requirements

A. Conditions for Obtaining a Degree

In order to obtain a degree from the Department of Nursing, the successful completion of the commitments in forty-five (45) courses is required: thirty nine (39) compulsory semester courses which constitute the main body of the undergraduate study program and six (6) optional compulsory courses. The above conditions correspond to the accumulation of 240 Credits (ECTS), which must be accumulated in a minimum duration of eight (8) semesters, i.e. 30 ECTS credits each semester.

B. Expected Learning Outcomes and Skills of Graduates

Upon successful completion of the requirements of the study program, the graduates of the Department of Nursing:

- Possess general and specific scientific, theoretical and applied knowledge throughout the spectrum of Nursing Science.
- Have a complete body of knowledge, critical thinking skills and clinical skills in order to practice the profession of Nursing by providing nursing health care (prevention, treatment, rehabilitation) at all levels of health care (primary, secondary and tertiary care), in private and public health care sector, either as self-employed or as executives of nursing units and nursing services.
- Have skills to apply the nursing process, as well as holistic health care interventions based on nursing protocols, scientific evidence and health care guidelines, and to be actively involved in the design, evaluation and implementation of multidisciplinary interventions.
- Have the ability to teach and train patients and junior fellow nurses in the context of professional practice and to conduct research in the field of nursing science and / or in the wider field of health sciences.

4.4 Grading scheme and, if available, grade distribution guidance

A. Grading system

Each course or other educational activity is marked in integers on a ten-point scale from 0 to 10. A grade of 5 or greater is required for being successful. Converting to percentages, and since the maximum performance equals 100%, the minimum successful performance is considered to be 50%.

The degree is awarded with a grade in the form of a decimal number with the accuracy of two decimal points, from 5.00 to 10.00. The degree states the distinctive marks "Excellent", "Very Good" and "Good" depending on the grade as follows:

"Excellent": from grade 8,50 up to 10,0

"Very Good": from grade 6,50 up to 8,49

"Good": from grade 5,00 up to 6,49

B. Way of calculating the grade of the Degree

The way of calculating the grade of the Degree awarded by the Department of Nursing of the University of Thessaly has been adjusted according to the provisions of the Ministry of Education.

Φ5/89656/B3/2007 (Government Gazette 1466/B'/ 2007) "Implementation of the Credit Transfer and Accumulation System" and the classification of the degree score is added to the Diploma Supplement.

Degree Grade

The degree grade is calculated according to the following equation:

$$[\text{Grade Course 1} \times \text{ECTS of Course 1}] + [\text{Grade Course 2} \times \text{ECTS of Course 2}] + \dots$$

$$\dots + [\text{Grade Course 45} \times \text{ECTS of Course 45}] / \text{Total ECTS Degree Credits}$$

It is clarified that exempted and registered courses and ECTS credits of the exempted and registered courses are not included in the above equation as they are not graded.

The degree grade is determined as required by the applicable provisions, provided that the student completes the minimum number of credits required to obtain the degree.

5. INFORMATION ON THE FUNCTION OF THE QUALIFICATION

5.1 Access to further study

The Degree awarded by the Department of Nursing, is a 1st level degree and provides the opportunity for postgraduate studies that lead to the award of a Master's Degree (2nd level degree) or to studies leading to Doctoral Degree.

5.2 Professional status (if applicable)

To The degree awarded by the Department of Nursing, School of Health Sciences, University of Thessaly leads to the practice of the Nursing profession, a legally regulated profession, which according to the European Directives is described as a "General Care Nurse", taking into account:

The graduates of the Department of Nursing of the School of Health Sciences of the University of Thessaly have the professional title "Nurse" and hold general and special scientific, theoretical and applied knowledge in the whole spectrum of Nursing science. After obtaining a license to practice, they practice the profession of Nursing providing nursing health care (prevention, treatment, rehabilitation) at all levels of health care provision (primary, secondary and tertiary health care services), in the private and public sector, either as freelancers or as executives of nursing units and nursing services. In addition, graduates of the Nursing Department of the School of Health Sciences of the University of Thessaly can work as school nurses in primary and secondary education, as teachers in any level of education of public or private institution, as well as in any institution or vocational training center, management services and research organizations and as researchers.

The Member States of the European Union recognize the Nursing Degree provided by the Department of Nursing of the University of Thessaly.

6. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

6.1 Other information

The Department of Nursing, School of Health Sciences, University of Thessaly is based in Larissa, was established under Law 4589 (Government Gazette 13/29-01-2019/LAD) and accepted students for the first time in the academic year 2019-2020. The mission of the Department of Nursing is to provide high quality Nursing studies to its students, to cultivate clinical and critical thinking skills, research and innovation in the field of nursing science, so that the graduates of the Department are able to possess all the necessary knowledge and skills that will enable them to provide high quality nursing health care and have a successful professional and scientific career. The Department of Nursing in collaboration with the Department of Medicine of the University of Thessaly carry out two postgraduate programs specializing in Primary Health Care and in Ethics and Ethics in Biomedical Sciences, while at the same time implementing programs of lifelong learning through the University of Thessaly (KEAIBIM).

8. INFORMATION ON THE NATIONAL HIGHER EDUCATION SYSTEM

(i) Structure

1. Tertiary Education is provided by the Tertiary Education Institutions in Greece. These establishments are legal entities under public law and include: Universities, Technical Universities, The school of Fine Arts and the Higher School of Pedagogy and Technical Training.

2. The State Supervision towards the Greek Tertiary Education Institutions is exercised by the Minister of Education, according to article 16 of the Greek Constitution and the law No 4957/2022. The Independent Authority under the name "National Authority of Tertiary Education", article no 2 of the law 4653/2020 (A 12) is responsible for the assessment and certification of the Tertiary Education Institutions, of their

individual academic niches and their study programmes

(ii) Access

Entrance to the various Schools of the **Universities (Panepistimio)** depends on the general score obtained by Lyceum graduates on the Certificate, on the number of available places (numerus clausus) and on the candidates' ranked preferences among schools and sections.

(iii) Qualifications

Students who successfully complete their studies in universities and TEI are awarded a Ptychio (first cycle degree). First cycle programmes last from four years for most fields to five years for engineering and certain other applied science fields and six years for medicine. The Ptychio leads to employment or further study at the post-graduate level that includes the one year second cycle leading to the second degree, Diploma Metaptychiakon Spoudon - equivalent to the Master's degree - and the third cycle leading to the doctorate degree, Didaktoriko Diploma.

Legislation on quality assurance in Higher Education, the Credit Transfer System and the Diploma Supplement defines the framework and criteria for evaluation of university departments and for certification of student degrees. These measures aim at promoting student mobility and contributing to the creation of a European Higher Education Area.
